My name is Alexander Smith and my faith life started when I was 19 years old. I didn't have a religious upbringing but as an adult; I became curious and realized there was so much more to life than just the physical realities we perceive by purely natural means. I began to attend various Protestant churches and spent hours on end reading and studying the Bible both on my own and with an evangelical group called Bible Study Fellowship. Jesus promised us that those who earnestly seek will find and to those who knock the door will be opened, this is what happened to me in quite a dramatic way.




After attending protestant services and reading the Bible I began to discover the inherent contradiction of "Bible only, Faith only" theology, but this discovery was not something that I simply stumbled upon with my own intellect. I was at my house when I had an experience

that I believe was a true miracle. I found myself in a highly emotional state (which is fairly uncommon) but not a warm and fuzzy "religious high" kind of way, no this was an authentic conversion. I went from being an anti-Catholic protestant to a man who wanted nothing more than to be received into Jesus' Church within the span of 30 minutes. I frantically called my one and only Catholic friend and told him what happened. He said "finally my prayers and sufferings have paid off;" it's a day neither of us will ever forget. I began to fiercely inquire into every aspect of the Catholic Church- what a wealth of knowledge there is out there and there's still so much I don't know. The more I learned about the Church's teachings, the more I accepted because "as far as the Heavens are from the earth are my ways above yours, says the Lord." The Bible began to make so much more sense, I felt like my eyes had been opened to the Truth that had been hiding in plain sight all along. "You are Peter and upon this Rock, I will build my Church," "Unless you drink the blood of the Son of Man and eat His flesh you have no life within you" and so many more passages were brought into focus. I want to express my gratitude to my sponsor, my wife, the RCIA team, and everyone else who has been so helpful and supportive throughout this process. The Eucharist is something I have been looking forward to with great anticipation for over a year now and I am honored that all of you have welcomed me into your parish to receive this Sacrament with you!
